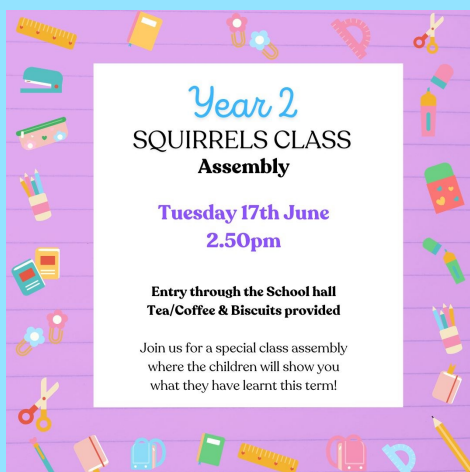
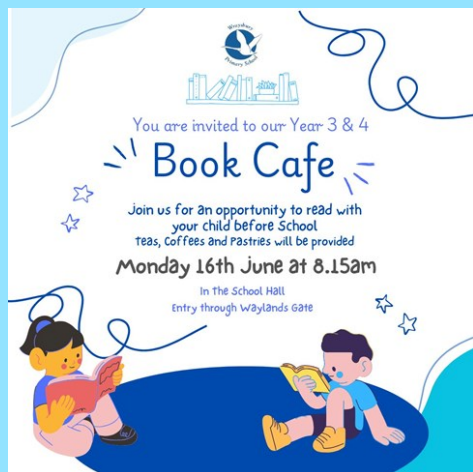
Reminders.....

- * All children are required to wear **black school shoes**, and not trainers.
- * **No false or painted nails, or make up** are allowed in school. Also, children will be asked to remove any jewellery (except religious items and stud earrings) worn to school.
- * Water bottles should be brought to school everyday. Bottles should be plastic with a sports lid, and contain plain water only.
- * Hair touching or past the shoulders must be completely tied back everyday. This is a safety precaution, and also helps prevent the spread of nits! Children whose hair is down will be asked to tie it back.
- * Lastly, we are a nut-free school, so please not nuts or nut-based products such as Nutella or Battenburg cake!

After School Fun Swim Sessions

There are still spaces available for all of the Fun Swim sessions, except for Year 1. Booking is made on Scopay, and each session costs £4 per child. Dates are as follows:

Year 5 & 6 — Mon 16th June Year 3 — Mon 30th June Year 4 — Mon 7th July Year 2 — Mon 21st July
All sessions are from 3:20—4pm and children should be collected from Waylands Gate.

School Meals

The lunch choices for week commencing **Monday 16th June 2025** are Week 2 of the Spring Summer Menu. Plain pasta is available on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, and jacket potatoes are served on Tuesday and Thursday. Both come with a selection of toppings.

From 1st April 2025, School Meals cost £2.79 per day, and we ask that accounts are kept in credit. There is a reminder function that can be set up on the Scopay system, which will alert you if your child's balance falls below an amount set by you. The menu is available on the website. If you are able to make choices in advance (up to the night before), it saves the children time during registration, and you can also encourage your child to try something new!

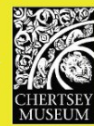

GP practices are busy and making an appointment with them is not always necessary!

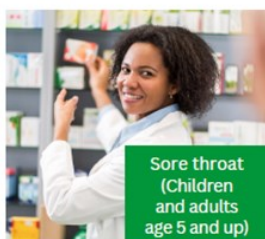
