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

- 2. Place 1 dice in a corner so that you can only see 3 sides like in the picture. Add up the total of the 3 faces you can see.


 Now move the dice around, what is the total of the 3 faces you can see? Keep moving the dice around so that difference faces are visible.

 What is the highest total you can make? What is the lowest total you can make?





Make a range of 3D shapes using match sticks, cut straws, or tooth picks. Join them together using playdough, blu tac or marshmallows.


Keep practising your times tables. They are so important. Try these websites to help you!

Draw out a multiplication grid and time how long it takes you to fill it in. Keep trying this over a few days and record your times. Are you getting faster?


