Content:

Lesson 1- Weathering and Erosion

• Children will learn the key aspects of physical geography, including the water cycle in the context of erosion and weathering.

The children will explore different types of weathering (physical, chemical and biological) through investigation.

Lesson 2 - Coastal Features

- To describe and understand key aspects of physical geography, including the water cycle in the context of coastal features.
- The children will investigate the formation of the coast (erosion and deposition) through video and explanation.
