Reminders....

- Parents should not enter the building other than through the office. This includes at the end of the day. K52 children finish at 3:20 and it is a safeguarding risk if adults are in school, unaccompanied. Adults seen in the building will be asked to leave immediately unless wearing a lanyard.
- Full school uniform must be worn to school everyday, including black shoes. Our policy is grey skirts, so please correct this as soon as possible if your child is wearing a black one.
- No make-up or jewellery (unless for religious reasons) should be worn in school including nail varnish or false nails.

School Meals




