- The ancient Egyptians built their pyramids about 2000 years earlier than the Maya.
- The Maya puramids were mainly used for presenting ceremonies.
- Maua originally descended from Russia and settled in rainforests in Mesoamerica.
- Maya kings and gueens, priests and noble merchants and craftspeople, peasants and farmer believed in gods and sacrifice heavens, moon, sun, rain, forests, animals.
- Maya were well-known for their advanced maths and calendars.
- The Maya civilisation certainly diminished. Historians think the decline started as a result of deforestation, wars and a severe drought.
- Maya people still live and go about their daily lives, just like we do.






Maya Numbers
