


#### School Meals

The lunch choices for week commencing **Tuesday** 3rd June 2025 are Week 3 of the Spring Summer Menu. Plain pasta is available on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, and jacket potatoes are served on Tuesday and Thursday. Both come with a selection of toppings.

From 1st April 2025, School Meals cost £2.79 per day, and we ask that accounts are kept in credit. **If you owe money, please clear this debt over half term**. There is a reminder function that can be set up on the Scopay system, which will alert you if your child's balance falls below an amount set by you. The menu is available on the website. If you are able to make choices in advance (up to the night before), it saves the children time during registration, and you can also encourage your child to try something new!
