	 How do you make stewed fruit? What jobs did they do? What is Stone Henge? Who were the Iron Age Celts and what did they do? How did they live?
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Content:

- Look rubbish from each classes bin and see what it tells us about what the class has done that day.
- Look at a variety of Stone Age houses and draw them, writing some facts that they have learned.
- Crood's Cave- (Dragon's Den style) where groups think of an invention that would have helped in a Stone Age house.
- Research Skara Brae and create a leaflet for it.
- Research different tools and choose one to draw and write facts about.
- Make tools out of chocolate.
- Research different Stone Age animals and answer questions about them.
- Go to the Eco-Area hunting and gathering.
- Take what they have gathered, and make stewed fruit- writing instructions.
- Research jobs that they did and write about which job they would like to have.
- Research Stone Henge and recreated it with biscuits.
- Learn about the Iron Age Celts and what they did.
- Look at how things moved on into Iron Age life.
