#### Areas of Development

The children will continue to learn/ consolidate their sounds this halfterm, particularly focusing on being able to form them correctly. We will learn how to blend/ segment so that they can begin to read and write words. The children will start to learn tricky words which they can recognise by sight when reading. In Maths, they will concentrate on recognising, using, counting and writing numbers 0-20. The children will consolidate their knowledge of 2D shapes and learn about their properties.
