

Topic Title: Swords and Sandals

KS2 Geography Intent: Where is Rome located and how is it different to the UK?

The children will learn where Italy is relative to other countries and will be able to locate Rome and other major cities, rivers and mountains in Italy. They will gain an understanding of ancient and modern Rome and be able to make clear comparisons. The children will be able to compare human and physical geography of Italy with that in the UK.

Content:	Key Vocabulary:
Where is Rome? Children to use atlases and maps to locate and identify Italy, Rome and the UK. Discuss with the children what countries make up the UK, locate these on a map. Can the children find Italy on a world map? Discuss capital cities with the children. What is the capital of countries within the UK? What is the capital of Italy? Can we locate these on a globe, atlases and maps?	maps, atlas, Italy, England, volcanoes, mountains, landscape, weather, temperature, climate, season, mountainous, population.
Comparing ancient and modern Italy.	
Discuss what an attraction is? Locate attractions on a map on Italy. Where is the colosseum? Where is the leaning tower of Pisa? Are the attractions different or the same (ancient/modern)?	
Compare Italy and England	
Discuss with children similarities and differences of Italy and England. Children to compare the similarities and differences between Italy and England in terms of weather, landscape, population, land use, trade links, settlements.
