From first hand observation, use simple line drawings to sketch the body in movement The children will explore how facial features alter when engaged in physical activity After exploring how artists create movement the children will create their own movement picture in the same style in their sketchbooks, annotating their work, describing how they used colour, form and style to replicate the artwork and to create the illusion of movement.
