Spring Curriculum:

Year 5 have been exploring the 'History of Theatre' in their topic, 'Lights Camera Action!'. To finish the topic, the children are now looking at silent movies and will create a biography about Charlie Chaplin.

After this, Year 5 will begin their new topic, 'To Infinity and Beyond!'. The children will explore Space; learn about the 'space race'; study the text *Cosmic by Frank Cottrell Boyce* and consider the role of women at NASA.

Year 6 have started this term with the topic, 'Sail Away!'. The children have explored inheritance, variation and evolution. They have met Charles Darwin and used geographical skills to track the voyage of the HMS Beagle.

After half term, Year 6 will move on to 'Survivor!'. The children will be considering environmental issues that the world faces and explore real live survival stories.

Reading:

We love reading at Wraysbury and enjoy talking to the children about the range of reading that has taken place at home. We still encourage children to read daily but it should be for pleasure not a chore!

Reading Diaries still need to be in school daily. They are a great means of communication and provide the opportunity to share information about any reading that takes place at home.
