#### **Our Curriculum**

Year 5 have started their topic 'May the Force be with You' which focuses on space and the solar system. Next term, Year 5 will be travelling back in time to Ancient Greece through the topic, 'Who Let the Gods Out?'.

# Uniform

We have seen for ourselves just how much the children have grown and are aware that some children may have outgrown certain items; please let us know if this is the case.

#### **Reminder:**

- Only small stud earrings can be worn, which must be removed for PE
- Permitted religious bangles may be worn and must be covered with a sweatband for PE
- Long hair should be tied back at all times in school
- Shoes should be sensible, closed toe and black (NOT trainers)
- Nail varnish should be removed

# **Physical Education**

# Reading

We expect children in Year 5 and 6 to read every day and use their reading record to record any thoughts about their reading book. This should be signed daily. This enables the staff to have quality discussions with the children about their book. We love to use their thoughts to recommend texts to other children.

Please ensure that your child's reading book and reading record are in school every day as we do use them in class.

# **Healthy Snacks in School**

We do encourage children to bring fruit, dried fruit or vegetables to school to eat during break time. We find this to be particularly useful in keeping the rumbling tummies away until lunchtime!

# Pencil Cases

A polite reminder: pencil cases need to be **small** enough to fit inside their tray. This should contain their handwriting pen, pencil, rubber, barrel sharpener, small glue-stick, a selection of colouring pencils and highlighter pens.

We are still finding that children are bringing in lots of unnecessary equipment. Lots of 'Smiggle' pencils and rubbers are great but they do cause a lot of distraction during our learning time. **Reminder:** 

Due to COVID, children should not be sharing equipment in the classroom.
