| Physical Feature | Are natural e.g, mountains, seas, rivers |
| Human Feature | Has been built by people e.g. houses and roads |
| City | A place where lots of people live together |
| Town | A built-up area with a name and government smaller than a city. |
| Village | Community made up of a small number of houses smaller than a town. |
| Port | A harbour town where boats dock. |
| Harbour | A body of water where boats can be moored. |
| Promenade | A public walkway along the seafront |
| Beach | A narrow strip of land separating water and inland areas. |
| Cliff | A steep rockface or slope by coastline |
| Coast | Land area where the sea meets the land |
