<u>Topic</u>

This term the children have been learning all about Space in our themed topic 'To Infinity and Beyond'. This has also covered their VIPERS (reading) learning. We have been reading a novel called 'Cosmic' that follows Liam, (a 12-year-old boy), who accidentally journeys into space. To allow the children's knowledge to develop, they have been challenged with the task of creating their own chapter for the novel. Each day they will be expected to add in the following:

- **Day 1** Use punctuation (capital letters, full stops, checking the sentences make sense).
- **Day 2** Build on punctuation (commas, exclamation and question marks, apostrophes for contraction and parenthesis).
- **Day 3** Building sentence phrases (relative and subordinate clauses, subordinating conjunctions; I SAW A WABUB and FANBOYS, and fronted adverbials).
- **Day 4** Using descriptive language (adjectives, character development; thoughts, feelings and actions, building inference).

Day 5 – Writing structure (linking paragraphs using adverbials).

The children will be using their Big Ideas Books to complete their writing.

To give the children a head start on their next topic 'Who Let the Gods Out?', please help them to research and record 5 facts about Greek gods, 5 facts about ancient Sparta and

Athens and 5 facts about modern-day Greece.
