Parents' Evening

Thank you to everyone for coming to the parents' evening back in the autumn term. We are sorry some of you couldn't make it, but the next one is on the calendar of dates. As part of the parents' evening we were updating our pupil data sheets and it is important that we do this each year. We will be contacting you if we have not got updated sheets and making arrangements for you to do this. Because of GDPR we are unable to just send these home book bags.

Online Payments

During the autumn term we were also trying to ensure that all of our parents were set up and using the online payment system. This makes things easier for you as parents (as all dinner money needs to paid in this way) but it is also so much easier for the office. Again we will be contacting parents who may not be set up for this and helping to ensure that this facility is working for you.

School Uniform and Winter Clothing

Recently we have noticed that a number of children are wearing the incorrect uniform or PE kit. Please note that the girls should have a **grey skirt/pinafore or black trousers.** Pale blue polo shirts or cotton shirts should be worn and not roll neck jumpers or long tops under their polo shirt. If the weather is particularly cold then a vest or short sleeved t-shirt may be worn (however it does get warm in the classrooms!)

For PE, boys and girls should be wearing navy blue shorts and a white t-shirt with **trainers for Infants and Juniors**. In colder weather the children may want to wear tracksuit bottoms and a sweatshirt or fleece to keep them warm when they are doing outside games.

When the weather is very wet or snowy we allow children to wear boots to and from school, but **please** can parents ensure that children bring their school shoes to change into in the building. Boots in the school building can mean a lot more wear and tear on our carpets and polished floors and the excess water makes it very slippery. If they do not have school shoes then we will ask them to change into their trainers.

A reminder about footwear, all children should be wearing black school shoes, not trainers. Please ensure that your child has the correct school uniform and equipment.

A Reminder of some of our School Uniform Rules

We have noticed that we have had to remind quite a few children of some important school rules. Please can you help your child by reinforcing these at home.

- Hair that is longer than shoulder length should be **tied up** please for health and safety reasons. A small discrete bow or ribbon may be worn
- We have a policy of **not allowing jewellery** except stud earnings but these must be removed for PE so it is better not to wear them at all. Bracelets and necklaces **should not** be worn
- Nail varnish and make up **should also not** be worn
- Pupils are welcome to bring their bike or scooter to school, but please ensure
 that they are NOT ridden on the school grounds and are locked up or put in
 the pod if you are leaving them here
- A reminder that pupils should not bring mobile phones to school. In exceptional circumstances (in agreement with the Headteacher), a Year 6 who is making their own way home may bring a phone in to be kept in the school office

Lateness

Please be aware that registration finishes at 9.00 and we expect the children to be on the school site for 8.55 when the bell rings. The children are involved in a variety of activities between 8.40 and 9.00 such as challenges, reading with an adult, support for learning later that day and so it is really beneficial for children to be in promptly to engage in this extra learning. The gates remain open for just a couple of minutes after 9.00 to allow you as parents to leave. Please don't try to come in if there are only a couple of minutes left, you may get trapped in school for the day! I appreciate that the traffic can be busy on some days but please try and allow for roadworks etc. If the gates are locked, please ensure you bring your child to the office via the front of the school and sign them in.

Foundation Stage parents, please ensure that you leave enough time to say goodbye to your child and exit through the school gates. We are not able to allow you through the main corridor for safeguarding reasons.

End of the School Day

A reminder that school finishes at 3.00 for Infants and 3.10 for Juniors. Unfortunately teachers are not able to look after children after this time as there are meetings and training courses that they need to attend. If a child has not been collected by 3.10 (Infants) and 3.20 (Juniors) then they will be brought to the school office where we will try and call parents and other emergency contacts. Our Health and Safety Policy contains a "left pupils clause" and should we not be able to contact any of the named contacts for a child we will seek advice from social care. In this respect it is absolutely vital that we are kept up to date with contact numbers. Thank you for supporting us with this.

Absence

A reminder please to ring into school and let us know if your child is going to be absent. Once the registers have been taken, we will text parents of pupils not in school for whom we don't have a reason. Please reply to the text by phoning the school office as if we don't hear from you we will contact other numbers on the child's emergency contact list. This is because it is really important we ensure that your child is safe. It is also a way of checking of course that nothing has happened to you during the morning or on your way to school. Should we not be able to communicate with anyone and check that everything is OK, we will start to contact other professionals to help us. Thank you for help and support with this.

If a child is off for a few days we will check in with you that everything is OK and we may be able to help with support and advice for you.

The uptake to our teacher led after school clubs has been brilliant this term and we apologise that we cannot accommodate all the children who wish to be involved. We continually look into ways to increase the numbers of children who can attend these clubs, but it is not always possible.
