Toys

Please could we ask that you apply long lasting sun cream at home in the morning and that each child has a named sun hat in school. Thanks This half term we will be working on reading and writing words/sentences independently without any adult input. Writing opportunities are available around the whole setting from writing a recipe in the mud kitchen to labelling a model in the junk modeling. Please could we ask that you discuss with your child at home where they might like do some writing that day so that it is in the forefront of their mind when they come into school.

Examples of some writing opportunities:

Home corner - telephone messages, shopping lists, recipes, diary entries etc. Construction - labelling models e.g. boat Playdough - labelling creations Book corner - making little books, puppets and labelling Small world - writing a story, labelling characters etc. Creative Area: labelling creations Mud Kitchen: lists, recipes, instructions Junk modelling - labelling



When doing any writing at home please could you ask your child to hold his/her pencil in the tripod grip.

Literacy- We will continue learning our digraphs e.g. er/ow etc. and practise reading and writing with them. When writing we will be concentrating on leaving spaces between the words and finishing a sentence with a full stop.

Maths- We will be working on subtracting and number bonds to ten. We will also be revisiting many of the measures concepts e.g. weight etc.

Please could we ask you to read with your child at least **THREE times** a week and sign the notebook to let us know. Many thanks.



Independence

As the children are now approaching the end of Reception, we are encouraging a certain level of independence. Please could you help us with this by letting the children dress by themselves, which also means taking off, and putting on their own jumpers and coats. Some children are finding it challenging to look after our equipment and work as a team so if we could ask that they have responsibility for putting their own toys away at home or help with simple jobs around the house. Independence is vital so that the children have the confidence to take risks and take control of their own learning.
